THE idea that politicians are entitled to a taxpayer-funded chauffeur is enough to make some voters barking mad.

But what about a politician ordering that chauffeur to ferry his dogs across the state?

Training, Skills and Corrections Minister Steve Herbert initially seemed blissfully unaware of a problem when he told the Herald Sun yesterday that his driver, when "doing nothing", was happy to pick up pooches Patch and Ted.

Wow. A few hours later, as Premier Daniel Andrews's office

went into damage control, Herbert released a short statement saying that, on reflection, using a car paid for by taxpayers in this way was out of line with community expectations. The scrutiny is set to intensify today, owing to a complaint over his behaviour towards a chauffeur.

Approached by the Herald Sun about the complaint, Herbert conceded yesterday that one driver had been concerned that he had "raised (his) voice".

He vowed to defend himself against any accusations.

But the Premier will be under pressure to order a thorough investigation, given the standard he has set for ministers since former small business minister Adem Somyurek was stood down over allegations of inappropriate conduct.

Any investigation is likely to take some time to complete, of course.

And that's time during which Mr Andrews can hardly afford to be dogged by a Bronwyn Bishop-style saga over his minister's use of public money.

Remember the scandal of Bronny and Choppergate, in which it emerged that taxpayers were billed for flying the then Speaker of the House of Representatives to Victoria for a political fundraiser?

That saga dragged on for weeks, and caused both Bishop and the then prime minister, Tony Abbott, significant political damage.

At least in Bishop's case, she was the one inside the vehicle, taking the trip at taxpayers' expense.

At the time, the Premier said: "As a government we have set the standard on these issues and, be in no doubt, every member of my team will meet those standards."

Opposition Leader Matthew Guy said last night: "If Daniel Andrews practised what he preached, he'd sack this minister without delay."

He said Mr Herbert's use of his ministerial car was "arrogant and totally out of touch".

Mr Herbert initially tried to explain the pet transport service away, saying: "I have a house in the country and in the city and it suited the driver occasionally to pick up the dogs when she was doing nothing, rather than go home and then come back again."

Asked if it was appropriate, he said: "They didn't have to. The alternative was that I could have gone home and then come back.'

But the Herald Sun understands Mr Herbert was recently told to stop letting his dogs ride in the ministerial car.

Asked if he was aware of the complaint about his behaviour, Mr Herbert said: "I think (she) indicated that I raised my voice to her, I understand it was something like that, but I haven't seen anything like that and it's not the case," he said.

The Department of Premier and Cabinet said last night it had not received a complaint from a driver. tom.minear@news.com.au
