

# SLAM: Ten Years On

## How Melbourne's live music scene was saved







Ten years ago, the Victorian music community was at a crossroads. Draconian liquor licencing laws resulting in increasing compliance costs led venues to cancel live music. The venerable Tote Hotel closed its doors.

On 23 February 2010, the music community banded together and marched to Parliament demanding the laws be repealed. Ten years on, Melbourne's live music sector is once again thriving, boasting the highest number of venues per capita in the world.
